SUMMARY:

Objective:

The objective of the Public Information Workshops is to provide general information regarding the replacement of the Indian River Inlet Bridge to the citizens of Delaware who live and work near the existing bridge site. The Public Information Workshops provide an open forum where DelDOT and the FIGG Team interact with the Public to share ideas and present project progress reports.

Public Information Workshop #4:

Public Information Workshop #4 was the last in a series of successful workshops that were planned for the preliminary design phase of the project. It was held on Wednesday, August 20, 2003, at the Indian River Inlet site location of the proposed bridge replacement. This workshop was especially important because the project team unveiled the final preliminary designs for each component of the project (replacement bridge, roadway, and park enhancements) to the public. The workshop was advertised in local newspapers, on the project website (www.indianriverinletbridge.com), with flyers posted near the existing bridge, and with direct mailings. In addition, Design Charette participants and local government officials received invitations to the event. Copies of the advertisement, flyers, and invitations are included in Section 2 of this summary report.

Shortly before 5:00 p.m., FIGG Team members and DelDOT representatives greeted the workshop participants and general public as they arrived at the site and signed in. A typed list of attendees, including their name, organization, mailing address, and telephone number is included in Section 3. Agendas, printed on fans, were distributed to the participants as they arrived. Project schedules, relating to the replacement bridge and the park enhancements, were provided on the reverse side of the agendas. A copy of the agenda follows this summary.

FIGG Team members and DelDOT representatives were available at the workshop in order to clarify the information presented and to answer questions about particular issues or project parameters. Photographs taken at the workshop are included in Section 4.

Workshop Space:

Typically, the Public Information Workshops for this project have been held at schools or convention spaces. However, DelDOT and the FIGG Team decided to hold Public Information Workshop #4 at the Indian River Inlet site in order to attract a larger number of attendees and to help the participants to imagine the site conditions once all of the enhancement projects have been completed.

The workshop space consisted of two (2) large rectangular tents (40' wide x 100' long) in a L-shaped configuration. The tents were located in the northeast corner of the parking lot adjacent to the south inlet area bathhouse within the Delaware Seashore State Park. The tent that was parallel to the dune was used as the main or presentation tent and accommodated 300 workshop participants seated theatre style and a stage. Two (2) 12' x 12' projection screens flanked the stage and were used to display a simulcast video of the event and an electronic presentation. Sound equipment was used to ensure that all participants were able to hear each presenter.

The exhibit tent was used to display project visuals and provided an area for the public to meet and discuss the proposed project features. In addition, refreshments were served in the exhibit tent.

Unveiling Presentation:

The unveiling presentation began at 5:30 p.m. with welcoming remarks by Harriet Smith Windsor, Secretary of State for the State of Delaware followed by opening remarks by Nathan Hayward, III, Secretary of Transportation. Secretary Hayward was then joined by Secretary Windsor; John Hughes, Secretary of the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Controls; Carolann Wicks, DelDOT Chief Engineer; and Linda Figg, Director of Bridge Art, Figg Bridge Engineers (FIGG), for the unveiling of the proposed bridge model. After the model was unveiled, Linda Figg made a brief presentation describing the aesthetic details of the proposed bridge. Carolann Wicks and John Hughes followed with presentations regarding the Access Roadways and Park Improvements, respectively. Nathan Hayward ended the formal presentation by inviting the workshop participants to view the model at close range and to join the DelDOT and FIGG Team members for refreshments and discussion of the project.

Informative Displays:

Displays, printed on canvas and measuring 40" high and approximately 8' wide, were arranged around the perimeter of the exhibit tent. The displays depict key project features and parameters of the final preliminary design and explain the selected roadway and park enhancements for the project. Reduced copies of the displays and banners are included in Section 5.

A continual electronic display of the visual images from the bridge design details presentation was also shown in the exhibit tent.

Take-home Handouts and Comment Forms:

Two take-home handouts were provided to the public during the unveiling presentation. The first handout highlighted the bridge and was entitled, “*Community Vision In Harmony With Nature.*” This handout included renderings of the arch bridge with detailed descriptions of the unique features of this one of a kind structure.

The second handout was entitled, “*Park Enhancements*” and included renderings of the completed site improvements planned for the Indian River Inlet Area. The Proposed Park Master Plan was also included in the handout. Copies of the handouts may be found in Section 6.

Comment forms were distributed for the attendees to provide feedback on the information that was presented. After the workshop, the comment forms were collected and the responses recorded. The typed responses may be found in Section 7.

Next Steps:

The FIGG Team will continue to refine the designs for the project in the coming months. While the design activities remain ongoing, the model of the bridge structure will go on tour. The model will be displayed at several civic locations throughout Sussex County and, at the conclusion of the tour, will be on permanent display at DelDOT Headquarters in Dover, DE. Once the model tour schedule is determined, the dates and locations will be posted on the Indian River Inlet Bridge Website.

Public Information Workshop #4 concludes the preliminary design phase Public Involvement activities. However, DelDOT will continue to encourage public input throughout the final design. Plans for a fifth Public Information Workshop, tentatively scheduled for late February 2004, are in progress. In addition, the FIGG Team and DelDOT will be actively making presentations to schools, civic, government, and professional groups and organizations during the final design phase. In addition, a direct mail newsletter campaign will keep the citizens of Sussex County up to date on project related events and FIGG Team progress.


Attend the . . .

- A special presentation at 5:30 pm.




Public Played Important Role in Bridge Design





COMMUNITY VISION IN HARMONY WITH NATURE

The Indian River Inlet Bridge aesthetic design was created by the Sussex County community through two full day design charrettes and public workshops. The community worked closely with bridge engineers to select preferences that create a one-of-a-kind, world-class bridge. This intimate involvement captured the spirit of the local community. The bridge embraces a distinctive sense of place that will attract visitors to the picturesque views of the Delaware Seashore State Park.

The community chose a theme for the bridge of "Harmony with Nature" and a sub-theme of "Nautical/Celestial Navigation". To blend the bridge into its natural setting, the community chose elegant, flowing structural forms with organic qualities.

1. The grand sweeping arch rises from the ocean shoreline dunes. The base of the arch is founded on opposite sides of the inlet banks and it rises above the four-lane roadway. Located at the center, the arch forms a separation between the northbound and southbound traffic and preserves the extraordinary views of the ocean and bay for travelers. The arch, with its single plane of radial stays, supports a 1000' span across the waterway, avoiding the need for piers in the inlet. The color of the bridge will match the color of the sand so that the bridge forms the visual impression of being "born of the earth".


2. The tulip shape of the arch cross section is a curved organic shape with tapering sides. As the shape points to the earth and opens to the sky, its angles create a slender shape.




3. The single plane of radial circular stays is made of stainless steel, a low maintenance marine material. When the sun reflects on the stainless steel stays they will appear like rays of light reaching to the beach.




4. The bridge deck shape is sculpted in free-flowing curves, in keeping with the organic qualities of the natural environment.




5. A 12' pedestrian pathway on the oceanside of the bridge connects the sides of the inlet. The custom railing pattern reflects the grasses found in the dunes in a simplistic form. The top rail mirrors the tulip shape of the arch, while the bottom rail forms a wave pattern.



6. Five storyboards will be positioned along the pedestrian walkway railing, while an additional three boards will be along pathways at each end of the bridge. The stories on the boards will be discoveries of information for visitors to enjoy and learn about the land, beach, lighthouses, shallow river, deep river and, at the center of the bridge, the story of the sky with images of constellations and celestial navigation. The surface of the pathway will give the appearance of walking along the beach, with a sprinkling of images typically found on a beach walk, such as imprints of shells, feathers, bird tracks, etc.





7. The traffic railing will be partially open to provide those crossing the bridge with unobstructed vistas of the beautiful natural setting.



8. At night, the stays of the arch will be softly lit in blue. The silhouette of the arch, with its gentle light, will glow against the night sky, providing mariners with the gateway to the inlet. Pedestrian pathway lighting will be focused and directed from the railing towards the pathway, creating a necklace of light. Lighting will be on timers to ensure the comfort of campers nearby.



9. The concrete bridge abutment surfaces will be sculpted with an oceanfront landscape pattern, in harmony with the site. The impression is to mimic the view in order to make the bridge part of the landscape.



10. The bridge back spans are open, providing park visitors with easy and safe access under the bridge, along with many views of the new bridge.
